20	<u>PARTIES</u>					
21	1. Dr. Michael Marion, Jr. (Complainant) brings this Statement of Issues solely in his					
22	official capacity as the Bureau Chief of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education,					
23	Department of Consumer Affairs.					
24	2. On or about August 5, 2013, the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education received					
25	an application for Renewal for Approval to Operate and Offer Educational Programs for Non-					
26	Accredited Institution from John Ridgel's Academy of Beauty, Inc., ("Respondent") with Alice					
27	Hsu designated president, Chief Executive Officer and 75% owner. In her capacity as Chief					
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JURISDICTION

12. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs ("Director") for the Bureau, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Education Code unless otherwise indicated.

PERTINENT STATUTES AND REGULATIONS¹

13. California Education Code section 94891, subdivision (b), provides:

"To be granted a renewal of an approval to operate, the institution shall demonstrate its continued capacity to meet the minimum operating standards."

14. California Education Code section 94900, subdivision (b), provides:

"An institution shall maintain, for each student granted a degree or certificate by that institution, permanent records of all of the following:

- "(1) The degree or certificate granted and the date on which that degree or certificate was granted.
 - (2) The courses and units on which the certificate or degree was based.
 - (3) The grades earned by the student in each of those courses."
 - 15. California Education Code section 94934, subdivision (a), provides:

"As part of the compliance program, an institution shall submit an annual report to the bureau, under penalty of perjury, signed by a responsible corporate officer, by July 1 of each year, or another date designated by the bureau, and it shall include the following information for educational programs offered in the reporting period:

- "(1) The total number of students enrolled by level of degree or for a diploma.
- (2) The number of degrees, by level, and diplomas awarded.
- (3) The degree levels and diplomas offered.
- (4) The Student Performance Fact Sheet, as required pursuant to Section 94910.

20. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71930 provides, in pertinent part:

"(b)(1) In addition to permanently retaining a transcript as required by section 94900(b) of the Code, the institution shall maintain for a period of 5 years the pertinent student records described in Section 71920 from the student's date of completion or withdrawal.

21. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74110 provides:

- (a) The annual report required by Section 94934 of the Code shall include the information required by sections 94929.5 and 94934 for all educational programs offered in the prior calendar year, and all of the following for the prior calendar year:
- (1) Information regarding institutional branch campuses, including addresses and programs offered at each campus, if applicable;
- (2) Information regarding satellite locations, including addresses and with which campus(es) the satellite location is affiliated, if applicable;
- (3) Name of institutional accreditors for each branch and satellite campus, and for each such campus at which any programs have programmatic accreditation, the names of the programmatic accreditor for each such program, and effective dates for each programmatic accreditation, if applicable;
- (4) Information regarding participation in state and federal student loan and grant programs, including the total amount of funding received from each source for those students enrolled in an approved California school regardless of their state of residency;
- (5) Information regarding participation in other public funding programs, including the amount of funding received from each public funding source; for purposes of this section, public funding is any financial aid paid on behalf of students or directly to an institution from any public source, such as the Workforce Investment Act, any veterans' financial aid programs pursuant to Section 21.4253 of Title 38 of the Code of Federal Regulations or any other financial aid program that is intended to help students pay education-related expenses, including tuition, fees, room and board, and supplies for education; and

- (6) The total percentage of institutional income that comes from any public funding sources.
- (b) In addition to the information required by section 94934 and this section provided under penalty of perjury, the institution shall have annual financial statements prepared for the institution's prior fiscal year and signed under penalty of perjury, and shall submit a hard copy under separate cover of such statements in conjunction with its annual report. The form, content and mode of preparation of financial statements shall comply with Section 74115 of this Division. The Bureau may request that the institution immediately make available for inspection to a representative of the Bureau, these financial statements at the offices of the institution.
- (c) An institution shall file its annual report by December 1st. The Bureau may extend the period for filing if the institution demonstrates evidence of substantial need but in no case longer than 60 days. The institution shall not change the date of its filing its annual report because of a change in the fiscal year without the Bureau's approval.
- (d) The annual report shall be electronically filed by submitting the information required by section 94934 of the Code and this section via the online form provided on the Bureau's website, electronically attaching, as directed, the School Performance Fact Sheet, the enrollment agreement, and the school catalog.
 - 22. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112 provides, in pertinent part:
- (a) Format. The format for the Performance Fact Sheet shall be in at least 12 pt. type, in an easily readable font, with 1.15 line spacing and all titles and column headings shall be in bold 14 pt. type, which shall also identify the program for which the Performance Fact Sheet pertains. The Performance Fact Sheet shall contain all and only the information required or specifically permitted by sections 94910 and 94929.5 of the Code or this chapter. A separate Performance Fact Sheet shall be prepared for each program.
- (b) An institution offering educational programs that are too new to provide the required two years of data shall include the date the program began as well as the statement required by section 94910(e) of the Code. The Performance Fact Sheet shall also disclose the estimated date of availability for two full years of data for those programs.

- (c) Institutions approved under section 94874.8 of the Code, which do not include all required information per section 94874.8(a)(4), shall include on the Performance Fact Sheet the date of approval to operate and when the required data will be available.
 - (d) In addition to the definitions contained in section 94928 of the Code:
- (1) "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year, and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- (2) "Number of On-time Graduates" means the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
 - (3) "Gainfully Employed" means:
- (A)(i) The graduate is employed in a job classification under the United States Department of Labor's Standard Occupational Classification codes, using the Detailed Occupation (six-digit) level, for which the institution has identified in its catalog and in its employment positions list required by section 94910(f)(2) of the Code that the program prepares its graduates; and
- (ii) The graduate is employed in a single position or concurrent aggregated positions totaling at least 30 hours per week for 5 weeks (35 calendar days), or totaling at least 20 hours per week for 5 weeks (35 calendar days) with a statement signed by the graduate stating that he or she chose to seek part-time employment rather than fulltime employment after graduation; or
- (B) The graduate is employed by the same employer that employed the graduate before enrollment, and any of the following conditions are met:
- (i) the graduate is employed in an occupation with a different Detailed Occupation (six-digit) level Standard Occupational Classification code than applies to the position in which the graduate was employed before enrollment; or
- (ii) the employer or the graduate provides a statement to the effect that the employment after graduation was the result of a promotion with increased pay, due at least in part to graduation from the program; or

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- (A) The most recent three year cohort default rate, as reported by the United States Department of Education;
 - (B) The percentage of enrolled students receiving federal student loans;
- (C) The average amount of federal student loan debt of those graduates who have federal student loan debt in the reporting year; and

 - 23. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74115 provides, in pertinent part:
- (a) This section applies to every set of financial statements required to be prepared or filed by the Act or by this chapter.
- (b) A set of financial statements shall contain, at a minimum, a balance sheet, an income statement, and a cash flow statement, and the preparation of financial statements, shall comply with all of the following:
- (1) Audited and reviewed financial statements shall be conducted and prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants by an independent certified public accountant who is not an employee, officer, or corporate director or member of the governing board of the institution.
- (2) Financial statements prepared on an annual basis as required by section 74110(b) shall be prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Nonprofit institutions shall provide annual financial statements as required under generally accepted accounting principles for nonprofit organizations.
- (3) The financial statements shall establish that the institution meets the requirements for financial resources required by Section 71745.

² California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112, contains numerous additional requirements pertaining to School Performance Fact Sheets, and those additional requirements are pertinent to the allegations set forth herein. Accordingly, Complainant hereby incorporates by reference the provisions set forth in California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112, in their entirety.

- (4) If an audit performed to determine compliance with any federal or state student financial aid program reveals any failure to comply with the requirements of the program and the noncompliance creates any liability or potential liability for the institution, the financial statements shall reflect the liability or potential liability.
- (5) Any audits shall demonstrate that the accountant obtained an understanding of the institution's internal financial control structure, assessed any risks, and has reported any material deficiencies in the internal controls.
- (c) Work papers for the financial statements shall be retained for five years from the date of the statements and shall be made available to the Bureau upon request.
- (d) "Current" with respect to financial statements means completed no sooner than 120 days prior to the time it is submitted to the Bureau, and covering no less than the most recent complete fiscal year. If more than 8 months will have elapsed between the close of the most recent complete fiscal year and the time it is submitted, the fiscal statements shall also cover no less than five months of that current fiscal year.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards – Current Audited and Reviewed Financial Statement Not Provided)

24. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891, subdivision (b), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74115, in that Respondent failed to provide a current audited and reviewed financial statement in its application or in its subsequently submitted mitigation materials.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards – Period Covered by Enrollment Agreement Not Indicated)

25. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891, subdivision (b), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71800, subdivision (b), in that the enrollment agreement provided by Respondent does not state the specific beginning and ending dates covered by the enrollment agreement.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards – Enrollment Agreement Not Compliant with Regard to Refund Policy and Date by Which Student Must Cancel/Withdraw)

26. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891, subdivision (b), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71800, subdivision (d), in that the enrollment agreement provided by Respondent is not compliant with respect to information provided to students about the refund policy and date by which they must exercise their right to cancel or withdraw.

FOURTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards – Housing Information Provided in School

Catalog Not Compliant)

27. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code sections 94891, subdivision (b), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71810, subdivision (b)(13)(B), in that the school catalog provided by Respondent does not contain information about the availability of housing located reasonably close to Respondent's facilities and/or a cost range for such housing.

FIFTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards – Failure to Provide Description of the Learning Skills to be Acquired by Student)

28. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code sections 94891, subdivision (b), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71710, subdivision (c)(6), in that Respondent failed to provide a description of the learning skills to be acquired completing each educational program offered by the school.

SIXTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards – Retention of Transcripts in Student Files)

29. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code sections 94891, subdivision (b), in conjunction with Education Code section 94900, subdivision (b), and California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71930, subdivision (b)(1), in that the materials
