STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

If you have received federal student financial aid funds, you are entitled to a refund of the monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. Your refund rights are described below.

Canceling Enrollment Prior to Starting Class: If you are not accepted into the college, the enrollment agreement will be cancelled, and we will refund all money paid within thirty days. You may cancel the enrollment agreement within three business days and receive a full refund of all money paid within thirty days. If you have not visited the college prior to enrollment, you may withdraw without penalty within three business days following a tour of the college facilities and inspection of equipment where your education services would be provided. You will also receive a full refund within thirty days if your educational services are discontinued or your starting date is postponed for more than 90 days. International students who have been accepted have a \$4,000 non-refundable fee unless denied a student visa. The enrollment agreement may be terminated by the college for unsatisfactory academic progress, poor attendance, use of controlled substances on campus, conduct detrimental to the college, failure to comply with financial aid regulations or non-observance of other student regulations. If you are dismissed, you may appeal to the resident/executive director of the college, whose decision will be final.

Withdrawing After Classes Have Started: A student has the right to withdraw from the college at any time. A refund will be based on the Institution's Refund Policy.
