Definitions

• Number of Students who Began the Program means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.

• **Students Available for Graduation** is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated or been called to active military duty.

• **Number of On-Time Graduates** is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.

• **On-Time Completion Rate** is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.

• **I50% Graduates** is the number of students who completed the program within I50% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).

• **I50% Completion Rate** is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.

• **Graduates Available for Employment** means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

• **Graduates Unavailable for Employment** means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

• Graduates Employed in the Field means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

• **Placement Rate Employed in the Field** is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

• **Number of Graduates Taking Exam** is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.

• **First Available Exam Date** is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.

• **Passage Rate** is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.

• Number who Passed First Available Exam is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

• **Salary** is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.

• **No Salary Information Reported** is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

California Education Code Section 94919(d) provides that students have the right to obtain a refund of charges if notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first class session, 01/09/23, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. In accordance with California Education Code Section 94919(d), the institution's policy is that all new and re-entry students have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement until midnight of the seventh day from the scheduled start date of the first module, not including holidays (but does include weekends and in-service days). If you cancel the agreement, the school will refund any money paid, less any deduction for equipment not timely returned in good condition, within 45 days after your notice of cancellation is received.

If the student obtains a loan to pay for an educational program, the student will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund. If the student is eligible for a loan guaranteed by the federal or state government and the student defaults on the loan, both of the following may occur: (1) The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may take action against the student, including applying any income tax refund to which the person is entitled to reduce the balance owed on the loan. (2) The student may not be eligible for any other federal student financial aid at another institution or other government assistance until the loan is repaid.

Procedure to Cancel

In accordance with California Education Code Section 94919(b), students shall notify the school in writing of the cancellation of their enrollment agreement ("Notice of Cancellation"). The Notice of Cancellation can be submitted by mail, email, fax or in person. If the Notice of Cancellation is received by mail, it is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with postage paid.
